

Issues for Christians for Ukraine and Russia Today

During March and April it has been hard to look at any news source without hearing about Russia's invasion of Ukraine. We need to pray for this conflict that experts around the world say could bring devastating ramifications for much of Eastern Europe.

This conflict has no doubt meant challenges for believers in Ukraine, Russia and across the region. Russia has been on Open Doors' Watch List and remains on the list of countries just outside the top 50. Most of the worst persecution in Russia stems from localized pressure and violence against believers. A series of laws were instituted in 2016 across the country and have been used to prosecute groups active in evangelism.

Two of the parts of Ukraine that have declared themselves independent, Luhansk and Doneskt, have imposed rules requiring religious organizations to register. This rule has proven extremely difficult for many Protestant churches. In Luhansk, books by Charles Spurgeon and Billy Graham were banned.

No matter what wars, conflict or persecution brings, the gospel will go on. Here's how to pray:

- 1. Pray for peace.
- 2. Pray for believers in Ukraine and Russia.
- 3. Ask God to open the hearts of leaders that they would not restrict the ability of believers to worship God freely.
- 4. Pray for those who have lost loved ones and are in the path of the military.
- Pray for those who have had to flee from their homes and many items they own.

<u>Why is OOR interested in Tactical Evangelism?</u> Since we were formed 7 years ago we have seen significant increase in Christian persecution and a significant decrease in reporting by the media.

I did some research last month to see what changes have occurred in the last 6 years and the results shocked me. In just 6 years (2015-2021) The percentage of persecution in all categories has grown beyond belief and the media coverage has disappeared. The numbers shown below were taken from the most conservative reporting outlet. You will see that in many area have become much more difficult for missionaries and the services and training provided by

Tactical Evangelism is becoming more and more necessary.
