This project was proposed and planned by one of the missionaries we have been working with that has a lot of experience in this area. If we are successful, this program could be a model for other missionaries in Africa. The details of the program are listed below.

Financial responsibility: Operation Orange Ribbon

Organizational planning and facilities responsibility: Resident missionary (name withheld for security purposes)

Meet every Sunday (Sunday was chosen because it is a normal business day for Muslins)

Every first Sunday children and parents will come together for a family talk.

Parents will be involved once a month.

Children will be in groups approximately of 10 according to age and class with one missionary.

Hour 1. Dedicated to studying scripture using Wisdom Discover Studies.

Hour 2. School assignments and homework will be given at least an hour.

Hour 3 & 4 Development of talent. (Music, arts and crafts. drama, poem, public speaking, writing. Children will be grouped according to their interest and talent.

Hour 5. Review and recap.

There will be lots of one-on-one mentoring.

Every first Sunday, with parents involved, a full day talking of family issues and the Bible. This will be the foundation of the gathering. Also, the children can demonstrate what they have been practicing for three weeks.


A smaller pilot program has already been tested and has been exceedingly successful. With the assistance of OOR they will be able to enlarge the program.

"Let the children come unto Me; and do not hinder them;" Jesus said to his disciples. Mark 10:14

A couple of years ago I heard our founder, Jesse French, talked about a vision he had for helping persecuted children in Africa. He shared how children could be sponsored in Christian learning environments to make a difference – a lasting difference in their lives – by introducing them to Jesus as their Savior. This could be the influence their families need to turn from hopelessness to lives lived for God. My heart quickly embraced his vision.

Fast forward to 2021... Jesse shared a video he recently received from our missionary liaison from one of the girls, who has benefitted from this schooling in a Christian environment. She is a beautiful young girl with a lovely smile and speaks about her 'nuclear family of eight'. She has four brothers and one sister. She says 'thank you for supporting me'. She hopes that we will support others like her who need schooling.

Similarly, several young teens under the care of one of our missionary partners, are all willing to be mentored and coached'. They want people to walk life with them and not the program, writes our missionary contact..

In their words, "for all these years I have been made to believe that Islam is the only true religion. But for this week, I am convinced that Christians know whom they believe and they are very confident. I am confused". Another says "I am a new person. I left my place after fighting some boys in the community. I am going back to reconcile with them. I am changed". And still another, "I didn't know that the sin of Adam affected the whole humanity. I now understand that solution to fallen nature is Jesus".

As I pause and reflect upon the comments of these young teens, I continue to be grateful for the simplicity of the gospel message that so clearly communicates the love God has for each of us and how it can touch the hearts of young people who have the opportunity to hear the Word.

According to Jesse, there are opportunities to reach many more young people like the young lady mentioned above, through the new youth program. I am excited to hear more information as it becomes available.

In my opinion, it looks like our support and prayers make a difference. We most likely will not meet these young people here on earth but we will meet one day in the Master's Home prepared for all those who embrace Christ. Thanks, Jesse, for your encouragement to keep us praying and giving.

Shocking Facts: Before January 2021 the country of Mexico was not ranked in the top 50 countries of high persecutions of Christians. Today they rank as #37!!

Currently in Mexico thirteen Christians are killed every day because they have chosen to follow Jesus as their Savior. That's 400 Christians per month!

We tend to think that the persecution of Christians or the Christian church only takes place in far away lands like the Middle East or Africa. In reality, it's next door to us in Mexico. The population of Mexico is around 133,870,000 of which it is estimated that 128,000,000 are of Christian beliefs.

In Mexico, the rise of criminal activity is spurned on by cartels in the use and sale of drugs. Christians are targeted because their beliefs are against corruption and the use of any drugs. Criminal gangs often attack Christian leaders for opposing their lifestyle of crime. These gangs will often go into villages and destroy them if the people don't co-operate. They kidnap young girls and sell them into prostitution to those willing to pay the price.

Please pray for those brothers and sisters across our border who are suffering for their belief in Christ. It's chilling to think that this same type of persecution could soon be on our doorstep here in America.

SUMMER CAMP



Thanks to your support we were able to sponsor 10 children to the 5-day camp in Mombasa, Kenya as well as partially finance cost of operations. Three were teens we sponsor in school.
