We learned of two situations, one involving two sisters and one concerning a teenage boy that needed immediate action. Listed below are short description of the situation and the actions we were able to take.

TWO SISTERS 4TH AND 6TH GRADE

With the leadership of a local a missionary in the area, we were able to fund the transition from a madrassa, a Islamic school that requires the memorization of the Koran , and placed them in a private school where they could take Christian classes. Their parents recently converted to Christianity from Islam. In Kenya education is not free. We cannot show pictures for security reasons. The school they were placed in has a great reputation and has out performed the state school academically for the last 5 years. We will take resposiblity for their tuition until they graduate. The picture below is a a picture of students where they are attending.



Paul a 16-year-old boy was raised in a Muslim family under very difficult circumstances, the Father has two wives and two families. He doesn't provide for the family of the young boy. There are 5 other children involved. The father is physically abusive when he is there. Paul, not his real name, has become very discouraged and is seeking to learn more about the Bible. We learned the day we decided to help Paul that he has accepted Christ as his Savior. We are committed to pay for his school tuition until he graduates. We also learned that his mother, a devout Muslim, has asked for a Bible to read.

FUNDED PARTTIME JOB FOR PAUL

This is a plan to provide a part time job for Paul, to earn money to feed himself and help feed his family. The family went without food many times. He will be working around a mission compound, doing yard work and odd jobs. His progress will be reported to us monthly.

Food for Thought

You are probably familiar with the oriental proverb "give man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime."

Applying this ancient advice Operation Orange Ribbon staff believe that if a man learns a useful skill it can be more beneficial to him in the long run than continually receiving the benevolence of others for his ongoing support.

Citing the plight of persecuted Muslims who embrace the Christian faith ------ these men often lose their job and the ability to care for and feed their families.

We would like to propose a few ideas for your consideration. What if through our combined efforts we 'taught' these new believers who lose their jobs to start a food coop? What if we gave them seed money to purchase goats so that would produce food, milk and cheese to feed a community? What if this opportunity would bring back their dignity in being able to support their family?
