This is a scene at Kibera, a large slum next to Nairobi, Kenya at a food distribution center. They are in lockdown due to the coronavirus. They cannot get out to work or earn a living. If they do not work today, they do not eat tomorrow. With your help, Operation Orange Ribbon was able to purchase food twice for approximately 20 families. (see picture on left)

JAMES and SARA



James and Sara, not their real names, are two of the bravest people I know of. They are MBB (Muslim background believers) As young adults they both accepted Christ as their savior.

They have been serving persecuted believers since 2005. Their home has been a safe haven for persecuted Christians for 15 years. They minister Kenyan and Somalian Muslim converts. They have become the family that the new converts have lost. In this culture, family is extremely important. Because of the loss of family support, loss of jobs and mental and physical persecution 80% convert back to Islam. Their mission is extremely important and we at OOR are privileged to have helped support their ministry. Sara converted after she graduated from high school. Her family was enraged. They beat her, held her prisoner, threatened to kill her, arrange a marriage for her with an older man that they felt could control her. She escaped and the family pursued her with the intent of killing her. Sara went into hiding for several years, all the while fearing she would be found and killed. Years later her brother came to their house three times with a gun to kill her. He later confessed that he did not know what stopped him. Sara sacrificed her family and safety to become a believer in Jesus Christ.

James's situation was also very traumatic including being jailed for being a terrorist. He was falsely accused by a Muslim neighbor. (For more detail see note below)


James and Sara minister to MBB, providing support, give them a safe place, minister to them, helping them become stronger in their faith and become the family they lost.

INDIA CONTINUES TO BE MORE HOSTILE TO IT'S 28.000.000 CHRISTIANS DAILY

The article below is written by Sam Elisha, President of S.E.M. International, an internationally known speaker for the persecuted church, and authority on many religions, such as Christianity, Hindu, and Islam. Sam and his wife Shukun are also the leaders of Operation Orange Ribbon's Columbia chapter.

Food for Thought

You are probably familiar with the oriental proverb "give man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime."

Applying this ancient advice Operation Orange Ribbon staff believe that if a man learns a useful skill it can be more beneficial to him in the long run than continually receiving the benevolence of others for his ongoing support. Citing the plight of persecuted Muslims who embrace the Christian faith ------ these men often lose their job and the ability to care for and feed their families.

We would like to propose a few ideas for your consideration. What if through our combined efforts we 'taught' these new believers who lose their jobs to start a food coop? What if we gave them seed money to purchase goats so that would produce food, milk and cheese to feed a community? What if this opportunity would bring back their dignity in being able to support their family?

Since Shakun and I were both born and raised in India to Christian parents, we have kept in touch with the plight of the Christian population in India. Even though the Constitution of India guarantees complete freedom of religious belief and practice to all its citizens, the actual treatment of religious minorities, especially those who follow the Christian faith, has left much to be desired. In fact, the treatment of Christians has deteriorated with the passage of time since the 1950s. India is a multi-religious country with the majority of its population professing the Hindu religion. The Hindus have taken pride in India's Hindu past believing that India led the ancient world in science and technology because of it. India is not presently leading the world because other religions have entered the country and polluted its culture. To gain its past glory, "foreign" religions like Christianity must be made to convert back to Hinduism. The present government ruling India is a Hindu nationalist government and thus the majority Hindu population draws encouragement from this fact and hence the instances of Christian persecution have increased several-fold. Most of the non-governmental organizations dealing with religious freedom issues, therefore, regularly report that India is among the top violators of religious freedom.
